Human Services for Success

The overarching goal is to deploy resources for services that will have the greatest impact on people's lives – not just in terms of number of people served, but also to the extent the service creates opportunities for success and self-sufficiency. Focus will be on initiatives that provide positive outcomes around the following areas:

- transportation (empower accessibility);
- help with childcare (empower people to work);
- recreation & youth development (after school programs, mentoring, police programs, Boys & Girls Clubs);
- ▶ food and nutrition assistance (support a holistic food program);
- increase employability programs (jobs skills training but also soft skills);
- case management & support (to help people get on their feet in a sustainable way); and
- affordable housing development and stabilization.

The LDC also supports the development of a regional facility to house needed programs such as services for seniors, job training classes, child support, wellness programs, and community activities.


HONORING AN EXTRAORDINARY VOLUNTEER


In honor and special recognition of Ernest "Rusty" Bristow's contribution and extraordinary community service on behalf of the Severn Community and Anne Arundel County.



Enhancing Educational Outcomes

- The LDC will work with AACPS to develop a "needs" list for schools within the three-mile radius that have had little or no LDC support to date and (a) may not have the internal support necessary to generate such a list on their own and/or (b) may have substandard or inadequate facilities.
- Educational initiatives submitted for LDC funding should be beyond what the Board of Education should be funding and not increase the County's maintenance of effort obligations.
- ► LDC funding should not be replacing funding that is available from other resources.





FY 2025 Grant Process

- ▶ Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 July 1, 2024 June 30, 2025
- ▶ Priority Areas
- ▶ 1. Human Services for Success
- ▶2. Beautifying & Revitalizing Communities
- ▶3. Enhancing Educational Outcomes
- ▶ Community Grants Nonprofit organizations and community associations serving communities and residents generally within a 3 mile radius can apply for up to \$40,000
- ▶Invitation Grants The LDC may identify unmet needs and priorities generally within the 3 mile radius and invite nonprofit organizations and institutions to apply for funding outside of the Community Grant pool of funding.

 LDC "Invite Only" and County Agency/Affiliate applicants present their proposals to the LDC

November 9, 2023

Grants/Application Workshop for applicants

January-March 2024

 LDC Grant Committee reviews applications and invites Community Grant applicants to make presentations

April 2024

 LDC makes final Invite Only and County
 Agency/Affiliate Grant award recommendations to the County Executive

May 2024

•LDC makes final Community Grant award recommendations

June 2024

•FY 2024 Budget approved by County Council

Summer 2024

 Grantees meet final grant award requirements and execute award agreements
