he Anne Arundel County Commission on Disability Issues welcomes you to the 2023-2024 edition of *The Directory for Older Adults, Individuals with Disabilities, and Caregivers.* The dedicated members of the Commission in-

vite you to use and share this directory to find services and resources for people living with disabilities in Anne Arundel County. Whether you or someone you love lives with a disability, this directory provides numerous contacts of service providers that can assist both caregivers and people with disabilities.

CODI was established in 1995 and serves to fulfill the mission of promoting and enhancing the quality of life for persons with disabilities in the following ways: advising county government on the coordination and development of government policies, programs, services, and allocation of resources for persons with disabilities, proposing the means to meet the needs of persons with disability, and coordinating with local and county organizations to provide strong supports and programs. Throughout the pandemic, the Commission has worked with County programs and services to ensure that people with disabilities had access to needed supplies as well as accessible testing and vaccine clinics.

In October of 2022, the Commission held its annual

Disability Awareness Day (DAD), recognizing individuals and businesses for their accomplishments and contributions in the field of disability services. The Westfield Annapolis Mall hosted this year's event, which marked a return to its traditional in-person format. Disability Awareness Day also celebrated the 32nd anniversary of the signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act and recognized Disability Awareness Day Honoree, Dr. Joan Mele-McCarthy, Executive Director of The Summit School. Eleven other individuals and organizations were also recognized for their work and service to those in Anne Arundel County living with a disability.

The Commission is composed of 15 voting members and numerous ex-officio county and state agency representatives involved

with disability issues. The Commission meets monthly virtually on the second Tuesday bi-monthly, a total of six times a year. The Commission and the Anne Arundel County Department of Aging and Disabilities are committed to serving county residents and visitors with disabilities. In compliance with the intent and the spirit of the Americans with Disabilities Act, our commitment is to ensure accessible facilities, programs, and services. Occasionally vacancies occur on the Commission, and if you have an interest in serving, please contact the Anne Arundel County Boards and Commissions Coordinator at (410) 222-1821.





TOP 10 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT Assisted Living

1. What Is Assisted Living? Assisted living is a type of housing for older adults that provides 24-hour supervision and support services to help individuals who require assistance with activities of daily living.

2. When Is It Time For Assisted Living? Deciding to move a family member into an assisted living residence can be a difficult situation. When a family member begins to require a level of care that you can no longer safely handle on your own, assisted living may be your best option. Assisted living provides an alternative for long-term care for your loved one who does not require skilled nursing care in a nursing home.

3. What Services Are Provided? Meal preparation, household chores, medication management, and assistance with bathing, dressing, and grooming are some of the services an assisted living can provide. Assisted living facilities are required to contract with a licensed registered nurse to oversee the clinical care provided to its residents.

4. How Do I Choose An Assisted Living Residence? Begin by speaking with family and friends to obtain information and personal recommendations. Next, make a list of features that will be important for your family member. Things to take into consideration include the price, location, and any amenities that are offered by the facility.

5. Are There Any Resources To Help With Finding An Assisted Living Residence?

To help you narrow your search, you may to contact the Assisted Living Program of the Anne Arundel County Department of Aging and Disabilities. Staff are available to answer your questions and assist you with narrowing your choices based on your individual needs and preferences. Once you have a list of residences to visit, you can begin to set up appointments to take a tour.

6. What Should I Look For When I Visit? When you tour a residence, be sure to request a copy of the residence's Uniform Disclosure Statement. This document provides information about which services the residence provides and whether the fee for that service is included in the monthly housing fee. It is important to know what is included in the base monthly rate, what services are available at an additional cost and the circumstances under which fees may increase.

7. When Should I Schedule My Visit? Consider visiting the facility during mealtime to get a better picture of the routine of the facility. It may also be beneficial to schedule a second visit at a different time in the day to observe activities and staff interactions with residents. Address any concerns with the assisted living manager.

8. My Family Has Chosen An Assisted Living Residence. What's Next? Request a copy of the Resident Agreement (contract). Be sure you understand the commitment you are making before signing. Consider having the Resident Agreement reviewed by an attorney.

9. Are There Any Financial Resources? Generally, the cost of assisted living is covered by the individual's income and savings. Long-term care insurance policies may cover some expenses for a specific period of time. Veterans and their spouses may be eligible for the Aid and Attendance benefit to help with the cost of assisted living. For low-income seniors, the Medicaid Community Options Waiver and Senior Assisted Living Subsidy are two programs offering financial assistance.

10. Is There Anything Else I Need To Know? Do your homework. Take time to visit different residences, interview staff and residents, and check survey reports. Get all of your questions answered to your satisfaction by the assisted living staff and trust your instincts.

1. What Is Medicare? Medicare is health insurance for people who are 65 and older. Medicare is also available for people younger than age 65 who have been determined to be disabled under Social Security Disability rules.

2. What Is Medicare Part A And How Much Does It Cost? Medicare Part A is insurance for inpatient hospitalization, skilled nursing facility care and hospice care. Medicare Part A is premium-free for most people. Medicare Part A has deductible and co-insurance amounts. These deductible and co-insurance amounts are detailed online at www.medicare.gov.

3. What Is Medicare Part B And How Much Does It Cost? Medicare Part B is insurance for outpatient health care. Medicare Part B has a monthly premium. The base premium for 2021 is \$148.50/month. People who are higher earners pay more for their monthly Medicare Part B premiums. Deductible, co-insurance, and premium amounts are detailed online at www.medicare.gov.

4. What Is Medicare Part D? Medicare Part D is outpatient prescription drug coverage. There are varying costs to this program including premium costs, deductible costs, and co-payment costs. Specifics on these costs are available online at www.medicare.gov.

5. What Is Medigap Insurance? Medigap (also called Medicare Supplement) is insurance sold by private companies to offset the out-of-pocket costs for Medicare Parts A and B.





HELP WITH MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG COST

If you are single and your income is below \$1,843 per month and your assets are below \$16,660(not counting your home, personal possessions, or car), there could be help. If you are married and your combined income is below \$2,485/month and your combined assets are below \$33,240 (not counting your home, personal possessions, or cars), there could be help.

6. What Is Medicare Advantage (Part C)? Medicare Advantage (also called Part C) is an alternative to Original Medicare. These are private companies that have contracted with Medicare to offer Medicare coverage through a managed care design. These are typically through a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) or Preferred Provider Organization (PPO) design.

7. Is There Any Help With The Costs Of Medicare? For people with limited income, help is available for both Medicare and Medicare prescription drug costs.

8. When Do I Enroll In Medicare? The answer depends on many variables: Are you still working and insured by employer-group insurance? Is your employer primary or secondary to Medicare? Are you eligible for Medicare because you are turning 65 or because you are under 65 and disabled?

9. What Resources Does Medicare Offer To Help With These Complex Decisions? You may call 1-800-Medicare (1-800-633-4227) or visit www.medicare.gov for more information.

10. Is There Any Other Source Of One-On-One Help With Sorting Out My Medicare Options? The Anne Arundel County Department of Aging and Disabilities offers one-on-one counseling through the State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP). SHIP counselors are specially trained volunteers who provide free, confidential and unbiased information to help you make an informed Medicare decision.

Advance Directives

hat is an advance directive? An advance directive is a document that states your choices about medical treatment, and names a person and an alternate who can make those decisions for you in the event that you are unable to do so yourself. An example is if you are in a serious accident and are unconscious or cannot speak. The person you chose to be your surrogate decision-maker is commonly referred to as a medical power-of-attorney or health care proxy. You may also create a living will (not to be confused with a will used after death) which is also an advance directive wherein you indicate what type of medical treatment you want or don't want at the end of life or in an emergency situation.

Who can have an advance directive? Anyone who is age 18 or older because injuries, accidents and illness can occur at any age. Once you are of legal age to make your own decisions, you can have an advance directive.

Who can make an advance directive? An advance directive can only be made by someone who is competent, and it must be made voluntarily. Note that you cannot "get power-of-attorney over someone". Only the individual can appoint their own medical decision-maker.

Who should I appoint to be my decision-maker?

You should appoint someone you trust and know will make decisions based on your values, goals, and preferences, and will follow your wishes. It can be a family member, friend, or trusted professional (such as an attorney). Make sure you discuss your decision with that person because it shouldn't be a surprise to the person you appoint. They should know what your wishes are and be agreeable to act in that capacity.



Who will make medical decisions for me if I don't have an advance directive? Your guardian (if appointed by the court), your spouse, adult children, parents, siblings, or a friend, if available. The decision-maker may or may not choose to do something that you want, and you may end up receiving more or less treatment than you would have preferred. Again, your best option is to have those choices in writing.

Does an advance directive need to be notarized? No. According to the Maryland Attorney General's Office, a written advance directive must be witnessed by two adults. Neither of the witnesses may be the person's health care agent, and at least one witness must have no financial interest in your death.

What is a psychiatric advance directive? A psychiatric advance directive is a written statement that documents your preferences for future mental health treatment, and allows appointment of a health care proxy to interpret those preferences during a crisis (National Resources Center on Psychiatric Advance Directives). It can include your preferred mental health providers and facilities, as well as preferred treatment medications. **Can I include organ donation in my advance directive?** Yes. There is a need for organ donation, and your age does not matter, but you must make arrangements in advance with the Maryland Anatomy Board or a non-profit organization such as the Anatomy Gifts Registry (see the "Resources" section for contact information).

Do I need to hire an attorney to prepare my advance directive? No, it is not necessary, but if you prefer to do so, an attorney experienced in estate planning or elder law is a good choice. There are websites noted in the "Resources" section of this Directory and others online that offer advance directive forms and instructions on how to complete them.

What should I do with my advance directive once it has been completed?

Give a copy to your health care proxy (and alternate, if you have named one), and your healthcare providers. If you live in an assisted living or nursing home, make sure they have a copy in your file or chart. You may also give copies to those individuals that are close to you.

How often should I update my ad-

vance directive? It is a good idea to review it annually to make sure the choices you made are still in line with your beliefs or if there has been a major medical change in your condition or a decline in your health. You also want to make sure your healthcare power-of-attorney is still available, willing, and capable of acting in that capacity.



Knowing When It's Time to Step In... and the Best Way to Do It

ven if your parent or another older loved one lives right down the street or next door, there may come a time when it is unsafe for them to live alone."

Planning for that time without taking over can be difficult. Keep in mind to always treat your loved one with dignity; ask for and listen to their opinions and concerns. Involve them in the decision making process, and treat them as the adult they are. Continue to encourage their independence, even if it becomes more limited.

When evaluating someone's ability to remain independent, caregivers should take a holistic approach and look at the overall health and safety of their loved one.



Have you noticed a change in their personal hygiene – untrimmed nails, body odor, poor oral hygiene, soiled clothing? Personal care may be getting more difficult; your loved one may be having difficulty getting in and out of the tub (or have a fear of falling while doing so); they might also be having a difficult time using the washer.

Has mail piled up because he/she is unable to sort through the piles of junk mail and ads? Are bills being paid on time? If you notice the house is unkempt, he/she may be having difficulty completing household tasks due to arthritis, osteoporosis, a vision impairment, or memory loss.

Is the individual losing weight? Is there food in the pantry and refrigerator? Do you see scorched pans? Spoiled food? Arthritis, strokes, or dementia can make it difficult to shop for and prepare meals. Do you notice any bruising or other injuries? Is your loved one able to manage steps? Does he/she appear unsteady on their feet? Are they avoiding exercising, socializing, getting in the shower because of a fear of falling?

Check for increased sweepstakes and charity mailings, unexplained telephone charges, multiple magazine subscriptions? Con artists target seniors who live alone. Is your loved one socially active or does he/she appear to be lonely?

If your loved one is prescribed medication, can they read the fine print and understand the directions? Are the bottles easy to open? Are there medications left when the bottle should be empty? If you are noticing changes that indicate your loved one needs more care, speak with him/her and determine if they recognize any areas where they might need help. Include your loved one in your search for resources in their community. Determine if he/she has a support network already – other family, neighbors, friends, church community – that can assist with some of the daily tasks? If you are concerned that there are serious issues (such as dementia) occurring, speak with your loved one's physician and let him/her know what you have noticed so that you can begin to develop a plan.

Be aware that it is very easy for family members to slip into a decision-making, protective role. But keep in mind that that attitude can lead to taking away someone's right to make decisions, or to at least be included in the decision making. Remember to ask what your loved one thinks will keep them safe, comfortable, and happy and try to work within those parameters.

If your loved one wants to remain in their home and is cognitively able to do so, there are multiple options to support that decision. He/she can hire individuals



or companies to do on-going home maintenance chores (mowing the lawn, shoveling the snow, home repairs, house cleaning, etc.). If grocery shopping has become too difficult, many of the area grocery stores now deliver. If he/she is unable to cook (or just doesn't like to do so) search out meal delivery services or enlist the help of family and friends to provide home cooked meals. If physical needs increase, a home care worker can be hired to provide some personal assistance. Check out the availability of local senior centers, which offer a socialization, education, and entertainment activities.

If your loved one does remain in their home, be sure to do a thorough safety check. Ensure all of the lights are working and clear away clutter and area rugs. AARP has an excellent safety checklist on their website. If you and your loved one agree he/she will move in with you, you can also use the safety checklist for your house. Keep in mind that you can bring a home care worker into your home to help with personal care tasks, if needed.

If your loved one requires or desires an assisted living setting, start you research by contacting the Area Agency on Aging in the county/city he/she wants to live. Assisted living facilities can range from four (4) to 150 beds. Assisted living residences provide 24-hour supervision and support to help individuals who need assistance with activities of daily living. Continuing Care Retirement Communities (CCRC) offer a range of housing options from independent living through skilled nursing care and several levels of medical and personal care services. Fees and contracts vary so read the contract carefully.

Keep in mind even if your loved one makes the decision to move, it will still be very emotional and he/ she may feel sadness and apprehension. Let the individual grieve. Let him/her make as many decisions as possible. As you help sort and organize for the downsizing of their home, allow him/her to reminisce and honor attachment to certain items and to memories.

Remember to be a good listener. And remember that developing a plan will take more than one conversation. Unless his/her safety seems to be in danger, follow their lead and make the necessary changes in increments. Develop a timeline for the move and keep checking back to see if their health or ability to care of themselves has changed.



ABUSE: Know The Signs And Where To Get Help



> Emotional/Verbal Abuse

Behaviors such as threats, explosive temper, insults, constant monitoring or "checking in", excessive texting, humiliation, intimidation, excessive jealousy/insecurity, or isolation from someone.

> Physical Abuse

Any intentional use of physical force with the intent to cause fear or injury, like hitting, shoving, biting, pinching, kicking, strangling, or using an object or weapon to harm.

> Financial Abuse/Exploitation

Using money, property, or access to someone else's accounts for one's own benefit without consent of the owner.

Sexual Abuse

Any action that impacts a person's ability to control their sexual activity or the circumstances in which sexual activity occurs, including restricting access to birth control.

> Stalking

Repeatedly watching, following, or harassing someone through actions that result in unwanted or obsessive attention. Using technology such as texting or social networking to bully, harass, or intimidate someone verbally or emotionally is also considered stalking.

What is a Long-Term Care Ombudsman?

A person who addresses resident complaints and advocates for improvements in nursing homes and assisted living facilities. The ombudsman is resident-centered and seeks to resolve issues and concerns of residents in long-term care to the resident's satisfaction and with the person's consent. The ombudsman works for Anne Arundel County Department of Aging & Disabilities.

How can the ombudsman help?

- Educate residents, their family, facility staff, and the public about residents' rights, signs and indicators of elder abuse, and aspects of good care in a nursing home and assisted living setting;
- Advocate for changes to improve residents' quality of life and care individually and as a group;
- Seek legal, administrative and other avenues to protect residents;
- Provide information to the public regarding long-term care facilities and services, legislative and policy issues;

Who can contact the Ombudsman Program?

Residents of long-term care, families, staff of facilities, and any person who has a concern about a resident or would like information about nursing homes and assisted living.

How do I contact an ombudsman?

Senior Center Plus

Senior Center Plus is a guided, engaging program for older adults. The mission of the program is to provide older adults with opportunities for socialization and recreation that enable them to remain engaged in the community while providing respite for care partners. The duration of this program is four hours and is supervised and assisted by trained staff. Lunch is provided during the program.

To be eligible for the Senior Center Plus program you must:

enior activity centers provide members a variety of social, educational and exciting opportunities to remain active in their communities and enrich their lives. Members can enjoy the centers by taking an exercise or dance class, having a meal with friends,

learning a foreign language or historical events, listening to a live musical performance, taking exciting trips, volunteering, or working on their fine arts and crafting skills, all in one place. Plus, senior activity centers are equipped with self directed services and activities including libraries, billiards, ping pong, exercise equipment and a safe comfortable space to gather with others for friendly tabletop games. Further, special events are always an exciting opportunity for center members to gather with their friends and neighbors to celebrate the holidays, milestones and recognize significant observances.

The Anne Arundel County Department of Aging and Disabilities operates senior activity centers throughout the county. We have centers in Arnold, Annapolis, Brooklyn Park, Odenton (O'Malley), Glen Burnie (Pascal), Pasadena, Edgewater (South County) and a brand new center in Severn. Membership at the centers is free and gives you access to activities at all of the county's senior activity centers. Many of the programs and activities offered

at the centers are free, and through our partnership with the Anne Arundel Community College offer continuing education classes for a moderate fee. Center members may take part in classes encompassing multiple subject areas, including: exercise, dance, fine arts, crafts, history, foreign languages, current events, music and use of technology. Senior activity centers are multi-dimensional, active, dynamic and progressive; a community focal point. According to the National Council on Aging (NCOA), there are over 11,000 senior activity centers serving over a million older adults each year in the United States. Most centers offer services and programs such as meal and

> nutrition programs, health and fitness classes, volunteer opportunities, social and recreational activities, lifelong learning programs, options for travel, participation in the arts, transportation, intergenerational activities, information and assistance, and a range of other social services for older adults. Senior activity center programs are as diverse as the members they serve. There is so much to do at your local senior activity center that you could spend all day, every day there and still not do it all.

> Many popular activities include: knitting and crocheting, quilting, sewing, genealogy, crafts, ceramics, and technology, just to name a few. Workshops and seminars on specific topics of interest are also available at the centers. > The Department of Aging and Disabilities Senior Nutrition Program offers lunch daily at the centers. Reservations are needed for meal service and can be made by contacting the

Congregate Meal Program

he Senior Nutrition Program Congregate Meal Program serves hot, nutritious meals to older adults in a congregate setting such as senior activity centers, senior housing locations, and community centers. There are 21 nutrition sites throughout the county that provide a lunch that meets 1/3 of the United States Recommended Daily Allowance to older adults 5 days a week. Breakfast is also served at 10 of these sites. Participants (see eligibility guidelines) of this program are not charged for the meals, however donations are accepted to help offset the cost. Please note that reservations are needed for meal service and can be made by contacting the site aide at the nutrition location you will be visiting.

Shop 'N Eat

The Shop 'N Eat Program (Subsidizing Healthyfood Options Plus Nutrition Education and Training) provides nutrition education to empower older adults to make healthy food selections while shopping through the use of subsidized grocery gift cards. Participants are able to purchase cash cards in increments of \$20 to a maximum of \$60 value (\$30 cost to participant) per session per participant. Limited quantities are available.

Distribution is held every two (2) months at 9 different locations located around Anne Arundel County (seven (7) senior activity centers, 2664 Riva Rd. in Annapolis, and 7320 Ritchie Highway in Glen Burnie). This program has a continuous registration process. Each participant must complete the application and attend the nutrition education class. Grocery gift cards can only be used to purchase consumable food products. Items not included are household items, personal care, pet care, alcohol mixers, and tobacco products.



Home-Delivered Meals

For those who want to continue living in their home, but who are unable to shop and cook, having meals delivered each day by a friendly volunteer can be an ideal service.

- Two nutritionally balanced meals one hot and one cold are brought into the home
- Meals are delivered Monday through Friday by a friendly volunteer (including holidays)
- Meals can be delivered on a long-term basis or a temporary basis
- Special diets can be accommodated
- Service can usually begin within a few days of application submission

The Assistive Technology Loan Program

Assistive technology is any item, piece of equipment, software program, or product system that is used to increase, maintain or improve the functional capabilities of persons with disabilities. Assistive technology allows individuals with disabilities to carry out activities of daily living (bathing, dressing, eating, etc.), participate in the workforce, communicate,

eating, etc.), participate in the workforce, communicate, learn, and enjoy recreational activities. Assistive technology can provide the support individuals with disabilities need to live independently.

At the Anne Arundel County Department of Aging and Disabilities, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Office maintains a collection of assistive technology that is available for loan or demonstration for Anne Arundel County employees, residents, their families, professionals, and educators who work with individuals with disabilities. Participants can borrow assistive technology equipment for a maximum of three (3) weeks or schedule a product demonstration with ADA staff free of charge. Assistive technology can be expensive. The Assistive Technology Loan Program will allow individuals living with disabilities to "try before you buy" and decide whether a particular assistive technology device is the best one for them.

ADA Office Staff is available to:

- Assist individuals with the identification of equipment available in the AT library
- Provide instruction on how to use the equipment
- Connect the individual with programs that can help the individual purchase equipment after the loan period is over, if financial assistance is needed



The Assistive Technology Loan Program has an inventory of assistive technology for those needing assistance with hearing, vision, mobility, and communication. Items within the Assistive Technology Loan Program for demonstrations and for loans are not for sale, however, staff will provide individuals with the opportunity to borrow and use the equipment to see if it meets the needs of the individual. Staff is also able to assist with locating resources to help individuals purchase assistive technology equipment. A virtual catalog is also available online where interested individuals can view the equipment along with a short description. The virtual catalog can be found by visiting the ADA Office webpage at www.aacounty. org/ATLoanProgram.

Anyone interested in learning more about the Assistive Technology Loan Program can contact the ADA Office at (410) 222-4383. You may also submit a request to borrow assistive technology equipment using the online request form found on the ADA Office's website. Once your request has been received, a staff member will contact you to set up an appointment to view available equipment, provide product information and demonstrations, and complete the application process to borrow equipment.



Mindful Coping with Chronic Conditions

cute illnesses last a few days to a few weeks. However, chronic conditions are different. And, in general, they

are more frequent as we age. A diagnosis of hypertension, diabetes, arthritis, cancer, or other long term conditions require us to think more about long term management of symptoms. Managing the symptoms of a chronic condition can be a 24/7 job, and can seem daunting for most of us. However, by using the tool of mindfulness with some perseverance, management becomes part of a healthy lifestyle. So, how can we make peace with ourselves when we are living with a chronic condition?

One of the tools we teach in our Living Well series is "using the mind". Mind-

fulness is an evidence based practice. Being mindfully present in the moment without judgment can help us to manage the negative and reinforce the positive. If you are struggling or overwhelmed by the symptoms of your chronic condition, here are a few tips on how to mindfully improve your experience.

Stress can impact our bodies in a negative way. Being in a constant state of stress or "fight or flight" can significantly affect an individual impacted by the symptoms of chronic conditions. Making a decision to learn more about your condition and how to manage it can make a huge difference in your prognosis and future. Check out the Living Well webpage and find a workshop to attend. You'll learn more about the tool of "using your mind" plus many others. 1. Practice self care and self compassion. Being mindful you realize the importance of self care and focus on solutions not the problem.

2. Don't allow your chronic condition to define who you are. Recognize you are not your illness. Focus on the things in life that bring you joy.

3. Incorporate a gratitude practice. No matter what is going on, there are so many things to be grateful for. Allow yourself to sit in the present moment as you recognize all that is here. This practice in itself will help you shift into well being.

4. Surround yourself with love and support. Create the environment you love and mindfully choose your support team.

5. Focus on the breath. Use the breath as an anchor to help promote relaxation and reduce stress and pain. Other options with the same benefits are guided imagery and a meditative body scan.

6. Incorporate mindful movement into your daily routine. Examples are walking while paying attention, yoga, and Tai Ji Quan: Movement for Better Balance. The latter two can be performed assisted or seated.





This program is an option to aid older adults and individuals with disabilities who would otherwise require nursing home or immediate care facility care.

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES:

• To be eligible an individual must be a Maryland resident and must have community Medical Assistance

• Individuals must meet a nursing facility level of care

SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Personal Assistance
- Nurse Monitoring
- Personal Emergency Response Systems (PERS)
 - Supports Planning
- Home Delivered Meals

CPAS COMMUNITY PERSONAL ASSISTANCE SERVICES

This program provides personal assistance services, including assistance with activities of daily living, to Medicaid participants.

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES:

- To be eligible an individual must be a Maryland resident and must have community Medical Assistance
- CPAS does not require the individual to meet a nursing facility level of care to participate. The individual must get a CPAS level of care

SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Nurse Monitoring
- Supports Planning

These programs have no caps on the number of eligible individuals who can be enrolled. 


