3 Options for Yard Waste Collection



- 1 Biodegradable paper yard waste bags
- Reusable container made of metal or rigid plastic, equipped with handles, and marked with an "X" on all Sides
- 3 Bundled branches tied securely with twine

BIN it, BAG it, BUNDLE it

Plastic bags and reusable, fabric bags are not acceptable curbside containers for yard waste.

Its purpose is to provide information about current and future operations at the Millersville Landfill & Resource Recovery Facility, and related activities that may interest our neighbors.



Central Recycling Center Upgrades

Please pardon our dust and minor interruptions in our services. Over the next year, the Bureau will be working on a number of upgrades at the Central Recycling Center (CRC) that will improve the customer experience for years to come.

- Meet & Greet Area, Used Oil & Antifreeze Drop-off Building upgrades. Construction is planned for May - July 2023 and will require an alternate traffic pattern near the entrance of the facility to accommodate the demolition and construction activities. Please be aware of this change in the coming weeks; no oil or antifreeze will be collected during construction.
- Lower Wall Drop-Off Area Upgrades, including structural repairs, paving, painting, signage, and stormwater pipe repair. Construction is planned for July-August 2023.

This project will require a full shutdown for the Lower Wall drop-off area over the course of the project as concrete pads and structural repairs will need to cure fully before resuming

dumpster transfer operations. During this time customers with larger loads will be asked to visit the Millersville Landfill recycling drop-off area, or one of the other two (2) County Recycling Centers.

Entrance Improvements along Burns Crossing Road, including turning lane extensions, front entrance landscaping, stormwater enhancements and new facility signage. Construction is planned for late fall 2023.

This project will create lane restrictions and overnight lane closures along Burns Crossing Road and at the three (3) entrances to the Bureau facilities for the entirety of the project.

GRASS-CYCLE!

SAVE your time and money while you feed your lawn. Mow it high and let it lie.

This Spring and Summer Remember These Grass-cycling Tips:

- Mow high and leave grass clippings on the lawn. Mowing higher helps the lawn crowd out weeds and results in more grass blades, more upright growth, better shade tolerance, and deeper roots.
- Use a mulching mower. They leave clippings in an even layer that blends in with your lawn.
- Grass clippings are 75 85% water so you can water less by leaving them on your lawn. They also return nutrients to the soil and can generate up to 50% of your lawn's fertilizer needs.
- Grass-cycling reduces the amount of organic material you dispose of, which helps the environment and saves money.
- Have you tried composting? Grass clippings, leaves, other yard waste, and certain food scraps can be composted in your own backyard!

During each event, trained personnel will ask you to remain in your car while they unload the HHW from your trunk. To make unloading safe for staff and fast for you:

- Tightly secure all container lids to avoid leaks and spills, then set your HHW in plastic totes or boxes to contain accidental spills during transport.
- Call 410-222-7951 before an event if you have any drums of material.
- Transfer large amounts of fuel into travel-safe gas cans so staff can empty them and return them back to the owner for reuse.
- Keep materials in their original packaging, when possible, and label anything that had to be packed in alternative containers. Never mix different types of HHW in one container.
- Secure material in your vehicle's trunk, backseat or truck bed, to keep it safely away from passengers during transport.
- Make sure items can be easily accessed. Never cover or block your materials under other items like trash or yard waste.
