

### Action Items

- Leadership and Partner Teams:
  - Submit videos to Lisa as nominees for Youth Subcommittee Member(s)
    - Youth Subcommittee Members will nominate
  - ENOUGH Track 2 Kick Off Meeting will be on January 31<sup>st</sup> hosted by GOC
- Lisa to:
  - Send follow up to include question for youth video submissions
  - Share a poll to gather availability for meeting schedules
  - Create a shared drive to keep all materials and data

### How We'll Work Together

- Selecting a youth member for the Resident Council
  - Strategy: share a name and a description of why they believe that young person should be added then the team can vote
    - **No limit to # of suggestions that can be submitted**
    - **Who are we looking for?**
      - **Age range: Ages 23 and under**
    - **Partner team members can also submit**
  - Ramocille has begun pulling together a group/information about residents who are active in the community in various capacities
    - Kendall is engaged with youth in the Brooklyn Park area
  - What about youth who have the ability, but don't have the opportunity? How do we bring them into the work?
    - Giving them an opportunity has the potential to break cycles for generations
  - There's an increase in suicidal ideology amongst youth – how do we address it?
  - Even though we are choosing one, allow youth to stay active and engaged throughout this process
    - **Create a youth based subcommittee rather than selecting an individual – then allow the youth to select the individual that they would like to represent them on the Resident Council**
      - Empowering and engaging the youth on a different level
  - **Timeline: 2 weeks from today February 6<sup>th</sup>**
  - **When we're down to a few names, we can have a short video interview/video submission for the youth to answer a question about what they'd like to see change in the neighborhood or why they'd like to be engaged in the work**
    - **Finalized Question: As a young person, if you had the power, what would you change in your community?**
  - How will we manage youth engagement in the Leadership Team?
    - The nominated member of the youth

- Will need to review the grant to determine youth subcommittee funding
  - Be sure that youth are aware of the expectation for engagement as the rep on the Leadership Team (# of meetings, time of meetings, etc.)
  - On zoom, more than one youth could engage
- Monthly meetings and format
  - In-person vs virtual
    - Do a mix of in-person and virtual
      - Data presentations: in-person
      - Discussion
  - Meeting dates & times
    - We will need the youth member/representative present for Leadership Team meetings
    - Lisa will create a poll
    - Resident council is not required to meet separately from Leadership team
  - **Next meeting agenda items:**
    - **Set group norms and expectations**
    - **Pam will share:**
      - **Existing data and then we'll discuss how to collect the remaining data we need; what will be the format for gathering additional information**
      - **Asset map from PCYF and plan how to continue the work**
    - **Updates on youth representation – including funding/stipends**
  - Open meetings, but set parameters/expectations for engagement from non-members
    - Could set as a panel rather than regular zoom meeting to allow fo public input
- Communications
  - Email will be the primary form of communication
  - Created a shared google folder to hold all info, data, meeting materials, photos, etc.
