## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE concerning: Subdivision and Development –  
2 Nonpublic Schools

5 nonpublic schools as designated by Maryland State Department of Education; making  
6 this Ordinance an emergency measure; and generally relating to subdivision and

#### 17 18 19 **17-2-101. Scope; applicability.** 20

21 (a) **Scope.** This article applies to all land located in the County, except that it does not  
22 apply to land owned or leased and developed by the County, the Board of Education, A  
23 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL APPROVED BY THE MARYLAND STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION,  
24 or for use as a public charter school, as defined in § 9-102 of the Education Article of the  
25 State Code, unless federal or State law requires compliance with this article. The provisions

1 of this article are minimum requirements and are in addition to other requirements of this  
2 Code.

4 SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an  
5 emergency ordinance and necessary for immediate preservation of the public peace, health,  
6 safety, and welfare, and being passed by the affirmative vote of five members of the County  
7 Council the same shall take effect the date it becomes law.
