The Chair called for Bill No. 10-25, as amended, An Ordinance concerning: Comprehensive Zoning – Region 1 – For the purpose of repealing certain comprehensive zoning maps for Region Planning Area No. 1; adopting the Anne Arundel County Digital Zoning Layer for Region Planning Area No. 1, covering Brooklyn Park, Linthicum Heights, Curtis Bay, Ferndale, BWI Airport, Harmans, and parts of Hanover; and generally relating to comprehensive zoning; and the Administrative Officer read a portion of the title.

Ethan Hunt, Director of Government Affairs, was accompanied by Cindy Carrier, Planning Administrator, Mark Wildonger, Senior Planner, and Kelly Kenney, Supervising County Attorney.

Mr. Hunt explained the background and purpose of the bills.

#### Bill No. 10-25, Amendment No. 22

This amendment changes the zoning of a portion of the property known as Parcel 189 on Tax Map 9, located at 7390 Baltimore Annapolis Boulevard, Glen Burnie, from W1-Industrial Park and R1-Residential to MXD-U-Urban Mixed Use; a portion of the property known as Parcel 189 on Tax Map 9, located at no # Baltimore Annapolis Boulevard, Glen Burnie, from W1-Industrial Park to MXD-U-Urban Mixed Use; and a portion of the property known as Parcel 181 on Tax Map 9, located at the Track Area between I-97 and Dorsey Road, Linthicum Heights, from W1-Industrial Park and W2-Light Industrial to MXD-U-Urban Mixed Use.
