# **Current Water Service Infrastructure**

The Heritage Harbour Water Pressure Zone is a subzone of the Broad Creek Water Pressure Zone.

The subzone currently receives water service through a single water main running along Harry S Truman Parkway, served by the Heritage Harbour Booster Pump Station.

The booster pump station contains a 12,000 gallon tank for operational use, only, which means the water pressure zone has no water storage for its users.

- It is one of three water pressure zones in the County without storage (Millersville & Brooklyn Park North)
- All other pressure zones in the County have a minimum of 70 gallons of storage per person served



## Heritage Harbour Water Pressure Zone Supply Challenges & Concerns

The water main along the Harry S. Truman Parkway has had several breaks. Water main breaks cause **disruptions and outages** to service and pose safety concerns if **there is not a backup water supply.** 

Due to the Heritage Harbour area receiving its water supply from this single water main, challenges and issues to water service can include:

- Lack of water supply and lower water pressure
- Limited fire prevention and suppression capabilities, impacting safety
- Strain on pumping station capacity and meeting service needs at peak usage hours



# Planning for Water Service Solutions

A new Elevated Water Storage Tank has been recommended and approved as part of the Anne Arundel County Water and Wastewater Master Plan.

The proposed Elevated Water Storage Tank will provide **one million gallons of water** to the area, addressing critical storage, service and safety needs.

Future planning also considers population increases and additional strain on existing infrastructure.
