19	(e) <b>Duration.</b> The tax credit shall be available to a Public Safety Officer eligible under
20	subsection (c) for a period of one taxable year and may be renewed upon application of the
21	Public Safety Officer for [[nine]] TWENTY-FOUR additional taxable years, for a maximum
22	total of [[ten]] TWENTY-FIVE taxable years.
