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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning: Zoning – Outdoor Lighting

2 FOR the purpose of requiring outdoor lighting in nonresidential zoning districts to be  
3 directed toward the property and away from adjoining residential lots; and generally  
4 relating to zoning.

5 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments: §18-3-201(b)  
6 Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended)

7 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,*  
8 That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:

### 17 18-3-201. Outdoor lighting.

18 (b) **Outdoor lighting in nonresidential zoning districts.** Outdoor light fixtures in  
19 nonresidential zoning districts shall be:

20 (1) **[[located]] LOCATED** at least 25 feet from the boundary of any residential district,  
21 except that the Office of Planning and Zoning may approve a lesser setback upon the filing  
22 of an application that describes the type, location, lumen rating, and height of an outdoor  
23 lighting fixture and the reasons why a lesser setback should be allowed. Potential reasons  
24 for a lesser setback may include the following:

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25 EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate new matter added to existing law.

26 [[Brackets]] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

Captions and taglines in **bold** in this bill are catchwords and are not law.

1           [[(1)]] (I) fixtures will not be visible at any point along the boundaries of the lot  
2 on which they are located due to the location of buildings or walls, topography, or similar  
3 visual barriers;

4  
5           [[(2)]] (II) lighting will have minimal offsite impact due to the distance of the  
6 fixtures from roads and neighboring properties;

7  
8           [[(3)]] (III) fixtures will incorporate additional shielding or other features to  
9 prevent offsite impact; or

10  
11           [[(4)]] (IV) lighting plans demonstrate other factors that will prevent glare and  
12 light spillover[[.]]; AND

13  
14           (2) ARRANGED TO DIRECT THE LIGHT DOWN TOWARD THE PROPERTY ON WHICH  
15 THE LIGHT FIXTURE IS LOCATED AND AWAY FROM ADJOINING RESIDENTIAL LOTS OR  
16 AIMED TO CONFINE THE LIGHT TO A SPECIFIC FEATURE, SUCH AS A PARKING LOT,  
17 WALKWAY OR ENTRANCE.

19           SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days  
20 from the date it becomes law.
