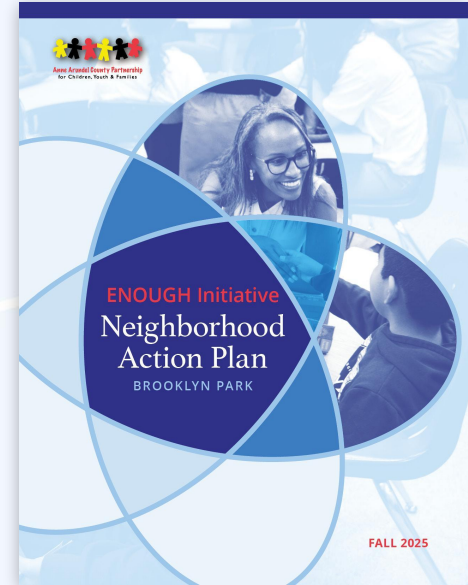

Safe and Thriving Communities Pillars

- Bike Safety & Lessons - Bike safety and confidence-building. Pedal Power Kids partners with schools to deliver engaging, age-appropriate programs that teach students how to ride safely, build confidence, and develop lifelong skills. Students will receive bike, helmet, and other safety gear after completion.
- Youth Diversion Program - Focus on 20 youth at North County High School referred by Anne Arundel County Public Schools



Healthy Families Pillar

- Mobile Food & Book Van - In partnership with Anne Arundel County Public Library, a food and book van would be operated to target identified areas to increase food access.
- Circle of Care: Expanding Maternal Peer Support - The specialized wrap-around care the AACDOH offers will provide critical, life-saving touchpoints for the perinatal women and families we serve in Brooklyn Park, Maryland.
- Potential Health Liaison to Total Health Care - Strategy to create access for Brooklyn Park residents to Total Federally Qualified Health Centers



High Quality Childcare & Education Pillar

- Junior Achievement of Central Maryland - Multiple programs available; JA's programs in the core content areas of work readiness, entrepreneurship and financial literacy ignite the spark in young people to experience and realize the opportunities and realities of work and life in the 21st century. On-site programming in Baltimore County (Halethrope area)
- Let's Go - Two available programs; STEM Accelerator & Teen Science Cafe Leadership Program. Introduces students to STEM and critical thinking skills, problem-solving, teamwork. Programs focus on Robotics. After school program
- Chesapeake Arts Center: Program 1: Free After School Programs at CAC for Belle Grove & BPMS (Grades 3-5 and BPMS)
- Chesapeake Arts Center: Program 2: Free Afterschool Program AT Belle Grove
- Fox Auto Second Phase Program (Post Boot Camp): Builds off skills from the Mechanic Summer Camp

All Pillars

- Youth Led Needs Assessment - Creating and executing a youth needs assessment to explore deeper understanding of what youth want for themselves in terms of enrichment and educational support
