### **Legislative and Fiscal Summary of Administration Legislation**

**Subject:** Resolution No. 16 -26 – RESOLUTION confirming the appointments of a member of the classified service (professional fire fighter) to serve on the Pension Oversight Commission for Anne Arundel County

This summary was prepared by the Anne Arundel County Government Relations Office for use by members of the Anne Arundel County Council during consideration of Resolution No. 16-26.

#### **Summary**

This resolution, introduced at the request of the Administration, appoints Steven Orlosky to the Pension Oversight Commission for Anne Arundel County for a term of four years. Section 606(a) of the Anne Arundel County Charter provides that there is a Pension Oversight Commission, independent of both the legislative and executive branches of the County government. Section 606(b)(1) of the Charter provides that the Pension Oversight Commission consists of nine members appointed by the County Executive and confirmed by resolution of the County Council, and Section 606(b)(3) provides that one member shall be a professional fire fighter selected from a list of members of the classified service nominated by secret ballot by members of the classified service. Section 606(c)(4) provides that a person may not serve for more than two terms as a member of the Commission and the term of the professional fire fighter who is a member of the classified service has expired.

The seat on the Commission reserved for a professional firefighter is currently held by Fire Lieutenant Jamie McKintosh, whose term has expired. Nominations were sought and two nominations were received - from Lt. McIntosh and Fire Battalion Chief Steven Orlosky. As two nominations were received, an election was held pursuant to Section 606(b)(3) of the Charter. Ballots were mailed to all active professional fire fighters, and the election window closed Friday, April 3, 2026. After counting all ballots submitted, Steven Orlosky was the winner of the election. Therefore, the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the County Council, is appointing classified service member Steven Orlosky (a professional fire fighter who is a

member of the classified service) to a term commencing on July 1, 2026, and expiring on June 30, 2030.

**Purpose**

The purpose of this Resolution is to appoint Fire Battalion Chief Steven Orlosky, a professional fire fighter who is a member of the classified service, to the Pension Oversight Commission, pursuant to the election required under Section 606(b)(3) of the County Charter.

**Fiscal Impact**

As this resolution appoints a member to a Commission for which they receive no compensation, there is no fiscal impact.
