

QUARANTINE TYPES & PROTOCOLS

10-Day Quarantine

Who: Owned cat or dog with human exposure.

Why: Observe for rabies symptoms. Healthy animal avoids victim treatment.

Requirements: Confined indoors, in a garage, or escape-proof enclosure.

- **Leash walks:** Only for bathroom; no free roaming.
- **Enclosures:** 15 ft from property lines, locked gates.
- **Supervision:** Do not leave tethered outside alone.
- **Follow-up:** Subject to inspection. Vaccinate after 10 days.

14-Day Quarantine

Who: Owned ferret, rabbit, or livestock with human exposure.

Why: Observation period to check for rabies.

Requirements: Same confinement as 10-day. Consult vet for vaccine after quarantine.

45-Day Strict Quarantine

Who: Animals with proof of rabies vaccine that had animal exposure.

Requirements: 10-day confinement rules. Get booster immediately; do not wait.

4-Month Strict Quarantine

Who: Owned cat/dog with NO proof of vaccine that had animal exposure.

Requirements: Double enclosure; zero animal/human contact.

- **Isolation:** No removal; single designated adult caregiver.
- **Care:** Immediate vet care & rabies vaccine. Subject to inspection.

6-Month Strict Quarantine

Who: Other mammals with NO proof of vaccine that had animal exposure.

Requirements: Double enclosure rules. Prompt rabies vaccination.

Suspected Rabies Case

Protocol: Human exposure to high-risk animal. Euthanize and test immediately. No quarantine.
