Brooklyn Park Resident Governance

- The Leadership Team meets monthly to drive the strategies in the Neighborhood Action Plan
- The Resident Council is built into the Leadership Team and has the ultimate veto over the Leadership Team
- 21 Leadership Team meetings with 369 attendees
- 5 Partner Team meetings with 109 attendees
- 4 Implementation subcommittees that meet to drive other strategies forward (Infrastructure, Prenatal, Monitoring, and Policy)

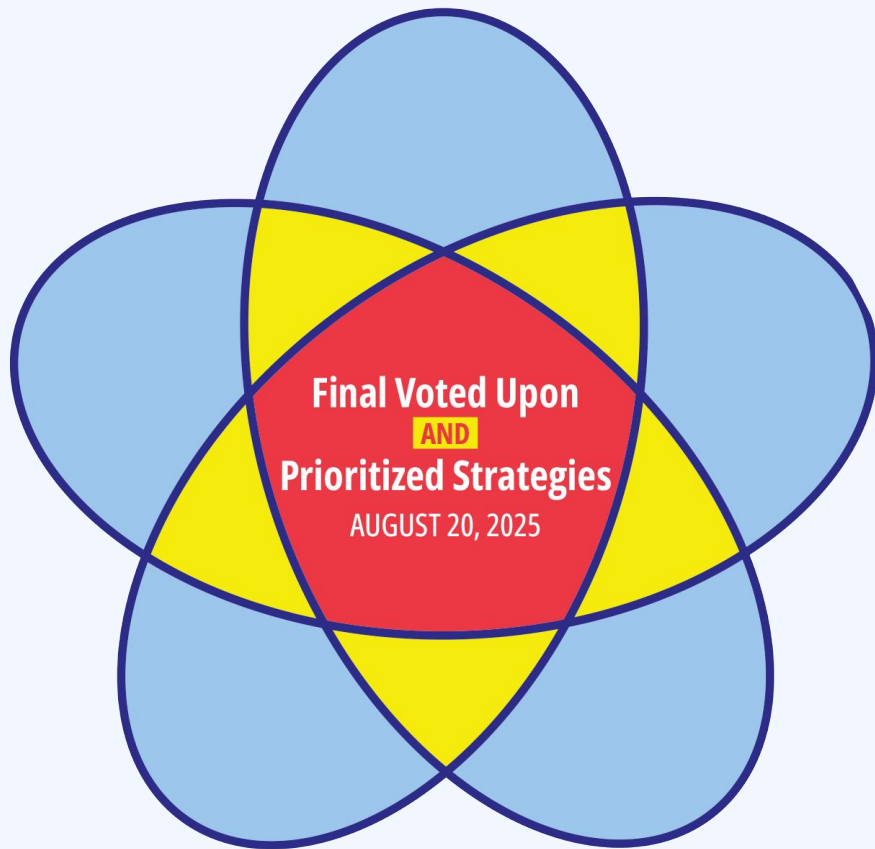


Subcommittees, 2026

We have 4 subcommittees operating to guide Implementation:

- **Prenatal Committee:** focused on prenatal to 3 programming. Two grants applied for
- Monitoring committee - Leadership Team will take part in program monitoring
- **Infrastructure Committee:** Discussion barriers to stability in the built environment. Currently examining need for grocery store and Patty Center in Brooklyn Park
- **Policy Committee:** Identifying policies that act as barriers to family success. Those identified are sent to the Governor's Office for Children to address at the state level
- **Monitoring Committee:** Leadership Team members participate in ongoing monitoring of vendors

PHASE 1: BUILDING THE STRUCTURAL FOUNDATION

Intake and GLS Assessment



Staff use the Garrett Life Skills assessment to identify "In Crisis" domains and set three primary goals.

Introduction of the Family Coach

Once stable, the Coach provides emotional well-being support and uses Motivational Interviewing for aspirational visioning.



The Case Manager (Structural Lead)

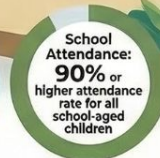
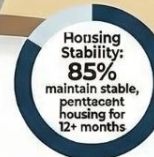
Manages logistics, secures housing/utility stability, and coordinates technical financial requirements and wealth infrastructure.

PHASE 2: ACHIEVING LONG-TERM FLOURISHING



Integrated Wealth Building

Families access a 4-1 savings match (up to \$7,500 total) for entrepreneurship, education, or homeownership.



Continuous 2-Gen Momentum

Bi-weekly strategy sessions and child care vouchers ensure parents can work while children thrive academically.

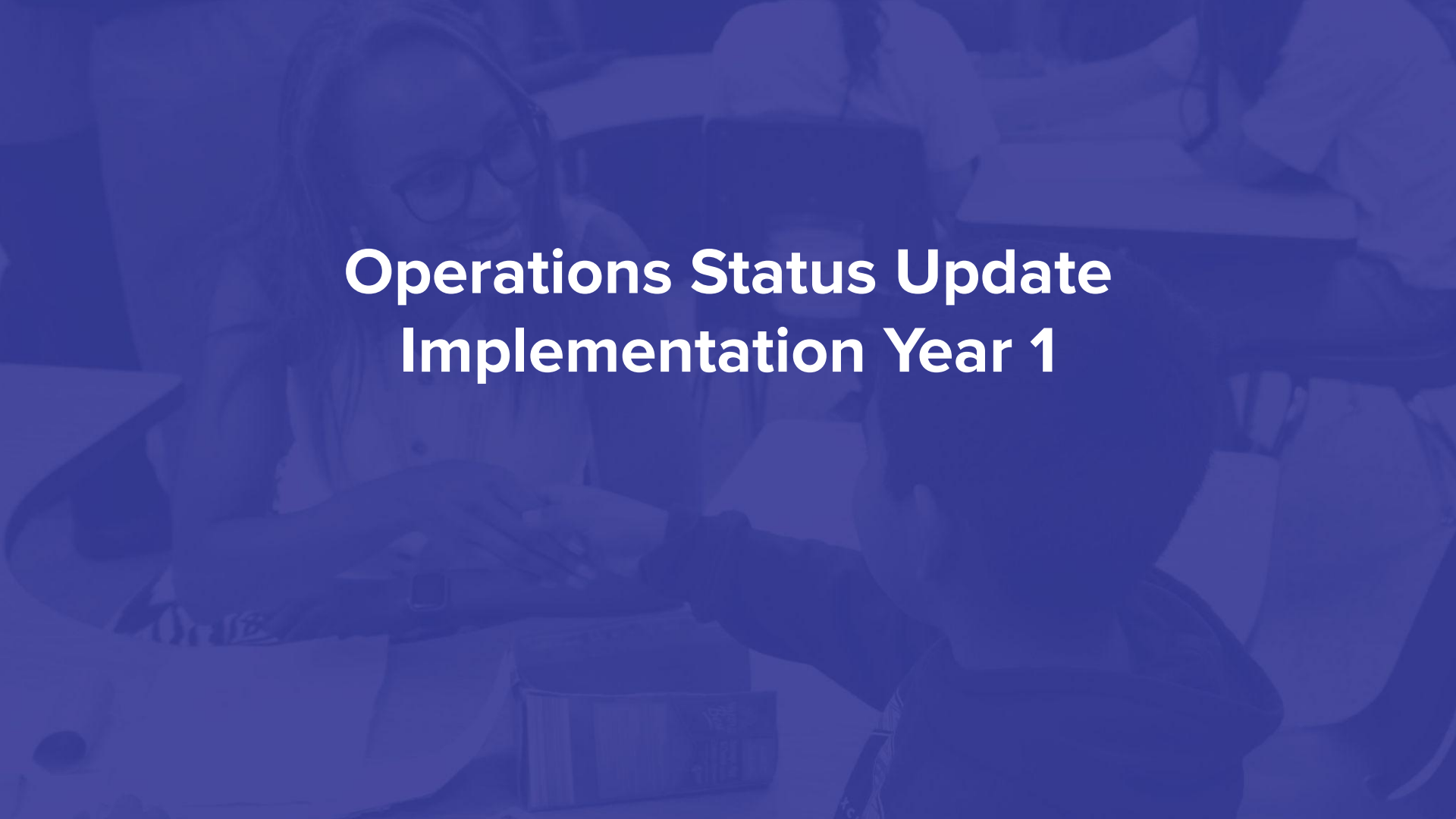
The Financial Glide Path

ENOUGH Implementation, Year 2

Braiding and Blending Diverse Funding to Support NAP

ENOUGH dollars (almost \$4 million) will not solve all the issues in Brooklyn Park. Other funding includes:

- County department funding
- State grants
- Not for profit funding
- Philanthropic funding

We estimate almost \$24 million braided and blended funding thus far.



Process for Decision Making ENOUGH Year 2 Implementation

- Review needs assessment and ensure new data is included. Identify areas missed in the last application.
- Review progress reports and new recommendations from our subcommittees
- Identify new programs related to identified gaps
- Discuss the budget
- Ensure all four ENOUGH pillars are adequately covered.
- Youth Committee - Special Summer Meeting to review
- Vote on the new strategies and the budget , June, 2026
- Submission of NOFA, July, 2026



Implementation Year 2 Strategies

The following strategies were identified in Implementation Year 1 but unfunded. The Leadership Team agreed to fund all previously identified strategies.

Private Security Camera	Riverside Road/West Meadow Ave/Roads next to Lloyd Keaser Center	This program offers rebates for the installation of security camera systems and covers the subscription costs.
BWMC Health Outreach	Patapsco Park Community - Hosted by Community Baptist Church & St. John United Methodist Church	Chronic Disease Prevention Classes Weekly free classes for the Patapsco Park/Pumphrey community to access chronic health prevention information, conducted by nurses at BWMC
Lloyd Keaser Cooking Classes	Lloyd Keaser Center	Prepping food for a healthy lifestyle. Families will have an opportunity to learn how to prepare healthy meals and food prep for meal longevity

ESL For Adults & Youth	Virtual - For Brooklyn Park adults	Virtual ESL Program is designed to help adult learners improve their English language proficiency in speaking, listening, reading, and writing through a structured online learning environment. The program provides accessible, high-quality instruction that supports participants in achieving personal, educational, and employment goals while building confidence in communicating in English. All enrolled participants will receive a FREE Chromebook to ensure they have the technology needed to fully participate in virtual instruction and complete assignments.

Lloyd Keaser Afterschool Program	Lloyd Keaser Community Center	Program to focus on academic support, featuring tutoring, recreation, and STEM. The Partnership is hiring a Maryland Out of School Time VISTA position to coordinate program planning
Spanish Liaison	Brooklyn Park	Position for ENOUGH at the Partnership to be a liaison with the Hispanic Community in Brooklyn Park. This person would navigate resources for families and also inform the Leadership Team of needs to future programming.
Increasing Funding Amounts for Flourishing Families	Brooklyn Park	The two-gen approach already used in the program centers on every member of the family rather than only the caregivers. The ENOUGH initiative will allow us to continue the two-gen intensive case management and family coach model, using wraparound principles and motivational interviewing, but will also offer: • A financial incentive, through creating savings accounts, in the form of a lump sum at the end of the program. • Childcare subsidy for those families who need to get to work • Access to all other strategies that the case manager and coach deem necessary for the family's economic mobility • One of the family members will be elected to serve on the Brooklyn Park Leadership Team to ensure family voice

Mobile Food & Book Van	Brooklyn Park - Focus on mobile home parks off of Belle Grove Road and Hammons Lane	In partnership with AACPL, a food and book van would be operated to target identified areas to increase food access.
Chesapeake Arts Center Art Program	Programming for Belle Grove & Brooklyn Park Middle Students at CAC and on site at Belle Grove	Free after school art programming
Youth Diversion Program	North County High School	Focus on 20 youth at North County High School referred by AACPS
Bike Safety & Lessons	Belle Grove Elementary School	Bike safety and confidence-building. PPK partners with schools to deliver engaging, age-appropriate programs that teach students how to ride safely, build confidence, and develop lifelong skills. Students will receive bike, helmet, and other safety gear after completion.
